Continuous LLIN Distribution in Zanzibar

How it works: ANC



- Pregnant woman goes to her first ANC visit
- She receives her pregnancy card and a net during her exam.
- The RCH nurse marks her pregnancy card to indicate that she has received a net
- She takes her net home and is protected during her pregnancy.

How it works: EPI



- Caretaker brings child for 9 month measles vaccination
- The RCH nurse gives the caretaker a net during the visit
- The RCH nurse marks the child's health card to indicate that a net was given
- The caretaker takes the net home and the child continues to be protected

How it works: Active Case Detection



- A person with malaria goes to the clinic for testing and has a positive test
- The ACD team visits the person's house to test the other members of the household for malaria.
- During the visit the ACD team observes whether the household is using their nets, and if there are enough nets
- If there are not enough nets, the ACD team gives the household a coupon to get a new net
- The household exchanges the coupon for a new net at the nearest health facility

How it works: Community Distribution



- A person who needs a net seeks out their Sheha or selected assistant Shehas, who have been provided with coupons
- The Sheha/assistant Sheha verifies that they meet the eligibility criteria (see next slide)
- The household exchanges the coupon for a new net at the nearest health facility
